## Practical information for incoming students

### Accommodation for Erasmus+ Students

The University of Art and Design (UAD) is able to provide Erasmus students with accommodation. Interested students are welcomed at the University dormitory, located in **Vaida Voievod street no. 6**. Some Romanian students are also accommodated there.

The rooms of the UAD dormitory have 2 or 3 beds (bed linen included) and one bathroom. The kitchen and the washing machine are common, one for each floor.

The dormitory is located at 500 meters from the “Red Building” (Departments of Ceramic-Glass/ Sculpture/ Fashion design/ Textile Design departments), 2 km from the main building of the UAD (Secretary ship, Rector ship, Department of Graphic art), 2,3 km from “Casa Matei” (Library, Department of Theory), 3 km from the Central Park (the building of the department of Painting) and about 3 km from the Department of Photo-Video. These distances can be easily traveled by bus or trolleybus. The bus station is near by the UAD dormitory.

The number of available rooms is limited. The fee of accommodation is about 100 EURO/student / room (The exact fee will be settled by the Senate of the University every year in September, before the academic year begins). Unfortunately UAD Cluj-Napoca does not have an appropriate infrastructure for people physically disabled.

## Living in Cluj

Students can live an active life in the city of Cluj-Napoca, they can visit parks and museums like: **The Art Museum, The History Museum of Transylvania, the Pharmacy Museum, The Ethnology Museum or The Botanical Garden.**

They can also visit the surroundings: beautiful countrysides like “**Apuseni**” **Mountains, “Cheile Turzii”, the salt mine from the city of Turda, or “Banffy” Castle from Bonțida** by train or by bus.

Life in the city of Cluj-Napoca is not very expensive. There are many market places (in every neighborhood), big stores and shopping centers. The cost of living (food) per month is about **150** euros for a person used to cook. There is a distance of 400 meters from UAD dormitory where is located one of the biggest malls in Cluj, Iulius Mall, which also includes a great food store.

## Visa, Insurance, Residence Permit

The students from EU member states do not need passport or visa to enter in Romania or for studying in UAD. They only need an ID card or passport as a valid proof of their identity.

After their arrival in Romania, the students of EU member states will make all the forms for the Residence Permit, at the General Inspectorate for Immigration. All the information about the Residence Permit is available here:

## Insurance and healthcare

Foreigner students are obliged to have a medical care/health insurance from their country or an European Health Insurance Card (for EU citizens) valid for the entire period of residence in Romania. Students can also take out an additional medical insurance in Romania.

Holders of the European Health Insurance Card may visit the Healthcare Centre for Higher Education Institutions no. 7 ( Policlinica studentească)

The address of the Healthcare Centre is: **Dormitory “Sport XXI” from “Iuliu Hațieganu” Park, “Pandurilor” street no. 7.**

The program of the Healthcare Centre is: Monday/ Wednesday: **14-19**; Tuesday/ Thursday/ Friday: **8-13**. (Dr: Mircea Bojan (MD), Medical Assistant: Monica Romanca).

Students who do not have the European Health Insurance Card should act according to the instructions given by their insurance company advisor.

In case of emergencies students may visit the Emergency Care Unit (Asistența Medicală de Urgență, “**Clinicii” street, No. 3-5**). In serious cases students may call **112**.
